

Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal

MAR20313 Certificate II in Maritime Operations
(Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal)



AMI is now offering the Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal in conjunction with North Regional TAFE (RTO#52788).

The **2-week** full time course is designed to provide students with knowledge, skills and competencies, which qualify them to:

- a) Command and operate a vessel <12 m long in inshore waters, carrying passengers and with propulsion power;
 - for an inboard engine – < 500 kW; or
 - for an outboard engine – unlimited; and
- b) Under the same propulsion power limits, command and operate vessel <12m long:
 - as a tender or auxiliary vessel – within 3 nm of a parent vessel in the Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ);
 - within waters designated for a specific purpose by a state or territory authority which permits holders of this certificate to operate (subject to any conditions that it may impose).

Certification





On successful completion of the full course, students will receive a qualification for MAR20313 Certificate II in Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal) from North Regional TAFE. This qualification meets AMSA requirements for Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal Certificate of Competency.

Please note students are required to have the required amount of sea service before they can seek certification from AMSA for the Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal Certificate of Competency.

Units of Competency:

- ✚ MARB002 Perform basic servicing and maintenance of main propulsion unit and auxiliary systems.
- ✚ MARC005 Operate inboard and outboard motors.
- ✚ MARC006 Operate main propulsion unit and auxiliary systems.
- ✚ MARH001 Plan and navigate a passage for a vessel up to 12 metres.
- ✚ MARI001 Comply with regulations to ensure safe operation of a vessel up to 12 metres.
- ✚ MARJ001 Follow environmental work practices.
- ✚ MARK001 Handle a vessel up to 12 metres.
- ✚ MARN002 Apply seamanship skills aboard a vessel up to 12 metres.

Elements of Shipboard Safety -

-  MARF001 Apply basic survival skills in the event of vessel abandonment.
-  MARF002 Follow procedures to minimise and fight fires on board a vessel.
-  MARF004 Meet work health and safety requirements.
-  MARF005 Survive at sea using survival craft.

Elements of Shipboard Safety is offered as a short course, before or after the Coxswain's course and is not included in the two weeks of study.

Pre-requisites

- ✓ Apply First Aid – Certification identifying HLTAID003 Provide first aid or equivalent

Hold a valid Senior First Aid Certificate (or equivalent) issued from a nationally registered RTO, showing the following units of competency:

HTLAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation

HTLAID002 Provide basic emergency life support

HTLAID003 Provide first aid

Short Courses

- ✓ Marine Radio (LROCP Long Range Operators Certificate of Proficiency)
- ✓ Elements of Shipboard Safety

The short courses can be completed at AMI for an additional fee – please enquire within for details.

Validity

The Coxswain Certificate of Competency is valid for five (5) years and requires revalidation with the regulator, prior to expiry.

When and where is the course run?

The Coxswain's course is run regularly (approx. three times per year) at AMI, located at 61 Quill Way, Henderson WA. Please contact reception for specific course dates.
