



# Marine Engine Driver Grade 2

## MAR30813 Certificate III in Maritime Operations (Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal)

**Australasian Maritime Institute (AMI) is now offering training and assessment of the Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal qualification in partnership with North Regional TAFE (NRT) #52788**

This **2-week, full-time** face to face course is designed to provide students with knowledge, skills and competencies, which will qualify them to:

- a) Act as Chief Engineer on a vessel with an inboard engine with propulsion power <750 kW in waters to the outer limits of the EEZ
- b) Act as Second Engineer on a vessel with an inboard engine with propulsion power <1500 kW in waters to the outer limits of the EEZ
- c) Act as Chief Engineer or Second Engineer on a vessel with an outboard engine with unlimited propulsion in waters to the outer limits of the EEZ
- d) Assist an engineer in any tasks that may be required on board while working under the direct supervision of the person in charge of the vessel's engines
- e) Work in the engine room of a vessel <80 m long with propulsion power <3000 kW.

The following Units of Competency, for the qualification requirements for MAR30813 Certificate III in Maritime Operations (Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal):

### **Units of Competency:**

- MARF001 Apply basic survival skills in the event of vessel abandonment
- MARF002 Follow procedures to minimise and fight fires on board a vessel
- MARF004 Meet work health and safety requirements
- MARF005 Survive at sea using survival craft
- BSBWOR203B Work effectively with others
- MARB006 Maintain marine internal combustion engines, propulsion plant and auxiliary systems
- MARC001 Complete engine room tasks
- MARC002 Maintain hull out of water
- MARC003 Operate and maintain extra low and low voltage electrical systems and equipment
- MARC004 Operate deck machinery
- MARC007 Operate marine internal combustion engines, and propulsion and auxiliary systems
- MARJ001 Follow environmental work practices
- MARB007 Undertake basic maintenance of electrical systems
- MARC008 Manage fuel systems
- MARC009 Operate and monitor marine internal combustion engines, propulsion plant and auxiliary systems
- MARC010 Operate electrical systems

**Costs:**

Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal - **\$ 1865.54**

Where course costs exceed \$1500.00, students are advised that a deposit of half (\$935.00) of the course fee is due on booking and the balance due on the second week of the course.

AMI are delivering this training and assessment and collecting fees on behalf of NRT. Students are engaging in government funded training.

**Refunds/Rescheduling/Cancellations**

If a student is unable to attend a scheduled course, AMI offers to refund or to reschedule attendance. In the event of a refund – a full refund (100%) will be provided to all students/employers where the request has been made seven (7) days prior to the course commencing.

If the request is made within three (3) days of the course commencing, AMI reserves the right to retain 30% of the fees paid for administrative purposes.

If the request is made on the day of the course commencing, no refund will be available to students/employers. Unless a medical certificate is provided and or a letter from an employer or evidence of compassionate grounds (AMI Management will make a final determination).

In the event of course cancellation, where the course has been cancelled by AMI, we will ensure that all students/employers are offered the opportunity to reschedule, receive a full refund of all fees/deposits paid and or offer another Registered Training Organisation to provide the training.

**Appeals, Complaints and Grievances**

If a student is dissatisfied with an assessment result, in the first instance they are directed to discuss with their Trainer and Assessor, and request clarification and feedback. Further assessment may be undertaken resolve the assessment result.

If a student remains dissatisfied with the outcome, an Appeal on the Assessment can be lodged with the administrant team and the Training Manager and/or Managing Director, will commence a review in to the assessment processes. ### ***Certification***

On successful completion of the full course, students will receive a qualification MAR30813 Certificate III in Maritime Operations (Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal), from North Regional TAFE.

This qualification meets Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) requirements for Marine Engine Driver Grade 2, Near Coastal.

*Your qualification will be issued within 30 days from the end of the course, by North Regional TAFE, providing that all fees have been paid and all units of competency have been successfully achieved.*

### ***AMSA requirements***

#### **Elements of Shipboard Safety**

This certificate is required when you make an application to AMSA for your Certificate of Competency, it is part of the qualification requirements, but some students may hold this or equivalent certification. Please check with administration as this two-day course is scheduled prior or after delivery of the main course requirements and incurs additional fees.

#### **VHF or Marine Radio**

This certificate (licence) is required, when you make an application to AMSA for your Certificate of Competency, but is not a qualification requirement. AMI offers Marine Radio, please enquire for further course details and fees.

#### **Apply first aid**

This certificate is required when you make an application to AMSA for your Certificate of Competency, and is not a qualification requirement. AMI does not currently offer this course.

### ***Validity***

The Marine Engine Driver Grade 2 Near Coastal, Certificate of Competency is valid for five years. You will need to revalidate with AMSA, prior to expiry of your Certificate of Competency.
