Helicopter Underwater Escape Training



Many occupations require employee's to undertake Helicopter Underwater Escape Training. The training is designed to prepare students for the unlikely event of being in a helicopter accident on both dry land and over water.

The course runs for a period of half (4 hours) day and comprises of the following modules:

Theory

Students will receive a comprehensive theory session which will cover helicopter travel, helicopter features, helicopter emergencies, and passenger reactions to onboard emergencies and incidents.

Practical

After completing the theory students will practice a range of simulated emergencies which will include escaping from a helicopter that has;

- ✓ Made an emergency descent to dry land
- ✓ Made an emergency descent to water
- ✓ Vertical submersions in water
- ✓ Capsized submersions in water

Following the HUET the students will participate in a short sea survival session where they will demonstrate various sea survival techniques.

Certification:

On successful completion of the course, participants will receive an OPITO approved certificate and a Nationally Recognised Statement of Attainment for PMAOHS214B Undertake helicopter safety and escape.

Validity:

The HUET training validity is company specific and students are encouraged to clarify this with their employer.

What will you need?

- ✓ A valid Medical (refer to accepted medicals)
- ✓ Lunch – there is a lunch bar within walking distance
- ✓ Bathers and towel
- ✓ Enclosed footwear and neat casual dress
- ✓ Passport photograph

HUET Medical Terms & Conditions:

Students undertaking training are required to submit to a medical examination. There are two options available:

- **Option 1 – Accepted Medicals:**

Provide a Current medical from:

- Medicals aligned to the UKOOA/OGUK guidelines.
- Aviation Authority Medicals (e.g. CASA, CAA).
- Maritime Authority/Directorate Medicals (e.g. AMSA).
- Commercial/Occupational dive medicals (e.g. AS/NZS 2299, UK HSE)

- **Option 2 – Undertake a new medical**

Students have the AMI Medical form signed off by a General Practitioner. This can incur a fee, depending on the practise. This needs to be completed prior to participating in training.
